

Emissions Reduction Fund Green Paper

The Australian Sustainable Built Environment Council welcomes the opportunity to comment on the Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF) Green Paper.

The Australian Sustainable Built Environment Council (ASBEC) is the peak body of key organisations committed to a sustainable built environment in Australia. ASBEC's membership consists of industry and professional associations, non-government organisations and government observers who are involved in the planning, design, delivery and operation of our built environment, and are concerned with the social, economic and environmental impacts of this sector.

The built environment has significant potential to deliver abatement, primarily through energy efficiency upgrades. If designed well, the ERF will provide a significant incentive for industry participants to take up abatement opportunities within their facilities.

To assist ASBEC's contribution to the Government's consultation process, a Direct Action workgroup was formed and the Property Council of Australia commissioned a report from ACIL Allen Consulting about the design and rules governing the ERF. This was submitted to the ERF Terms of Reference consultation process and subsequently endorsed by the full ASBEC Council at its meeting in November 2013.

The enclosed submission draws heavily on the ACIL Allen Report and we encourage the Government to consider the content of that report closely when developing the detail of the White Paper and draft legislation.
